In content-based instruction as in other experiential communicative language teaching approaches, the traditional second language instructional focus on raising learners' awareness of linguistic form is secondary to a focus on their learning and sharing of information through the medium of the second language, in a curriculum based on the language needed for learning the particular content.

Definition and main characteristics of content-based instruction. Brinton, Snow and Wesche (1989) define content-based instruction "as the integration of content with language-teaching aims" (p. 2). It involves the teaching of academic subject matter and second language skills.

Content-Based Instruction (CBI) is "an approach to second language teaching in which teaching is organized around the content or information that students will acquire, rather than around a linguistic or other type of syllabus" (Richards & Rodgers, 2001, p.204).

Content Based Instruction

The term content-based instruction (CBI), or content and language integrated learning (CLIL) as it is known in Europe, refers to a variety of instructional models in which academic subject matter is taught in a second or foreign language, such that students learn academic content and language skills simultaneously. Widdowson (1978), an early proponent of the integration of content and language learning, explains the concept as follows:

Content-Based Instruction / Content and Language ...

Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) is an approach where students learn a subject and a second language at the same time. A science course, for example, can be taught to students in English and they will not only learn about science, but they will also gain relevant vocabulary and language skills.
