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### Bronchitis Laryngitis Manual Guide

Laryngitis often occurs along with a viral infection, such as a cold or flu. Hoarseness tends to appear later in the illness, after the sore throat, sneezing, coughing and other symptoms. Bacterial infections of the breathing tubes (bronchitis) or lung (pneumonia) also can infect the larynx and cause laryngitis.

### Laryngitis Guide: Causes, Symptoms and Treatment Options

The most common cause of acute laryngitis is. Viral upper respiratory infection. Coughing-induced laryngitis may also occur in bronchitis, pneumonia, influenza, pertussis, measles, and diphtheria. Excessive use of the voice (especially with loud speaking or singing), allergic reactions, gastroesophageal reflux, bulimia, or inhalation of irritating substances (eg, cigarette smoke or certain aerosolized drugs) can cause acute or chronic laryngitis.

Laryngitis describes inflammation of the larynx, and a variety of causes result in the presentation of common symptoms. Laryngitis may be acute or chronic, infective or inflamma - tory, an isolated disorder, or part of systemic disease, and often includes symptoms such as hoarseness.

### Laryngitis

Laryngitis also may accompany bronchitis or any other inflammation or infection of the upper airways. Excessive use of the voice, allergies, inhalation of certain medications, or irritants such as cigarette smoke can cause acute or persistent (chronic) laryngitis. Bacterial infections of the larynx are extremely rare.

Hoarseness, a sensation of tickling, rawness, and a constant urge to clear the throat may occur. Symptoms vary with the severity of the inflammation. Fever, malaise, dysphagia, and throat pain may occur in more severe infections. Laryngeal edema, although rare, may cause stridor and dyspnea. Diagnosis.

You can manage most acute cases of laryngitis with self-care steps, such as resting your voice and drinking plenty of fluids. Strenuous use of your

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voice during an episode of acute laryngitis can damage your vocal cords. Make an appointment with a doctor if your laryngitis symptoms last more than two weeks. Seek immediate medical attention if you:

You should also drink more liquids if you are exercising. Try to drink enough liquid each day and not just when you feel thirsty. Voice rest: Complete voice rest for a few days may be needed until your symptoms improved. You may need to limit using your voice for a while if complete voice rest is not possible.

For either acute bronchitis or chronic bronchitis, signs and symptoms may include: Cough Production of mucus (sputum), which can be clear, white, yellowish-gray or green in color — rarely, it may be streaked with blood

Bronchitis is an inflammation of the large bronchi (medium-sized airways) in the lungs Acute bronchitis is usually caused by viruses or bacteria and may last several days or weeks. You need steam inhalation, sucking of cough lozenges and a course of antibiotics.

For laryngitis, a homeopath may also prescribe aconitum—especially from sudden symptoms. Homeopathic phosphorus is a common remedy for bronchitis, coughs, and laryngitis. Kali bichromicum is also considered the most effective remedy for sinuses, but can also be used for laryngitis and other throat conditions.

### **Can't Speak? The Homeopathic Remedy for Laryngitis**

Corticosteroids may be prescribed to reduce swelling and obstruction. Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) may be used as an alternative. Diuretic drugs may be used to relieve fluid buildup in the larynx and lungs. Identification and treatment of the primary cause of the laryngitis is essential.

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
