Piaget's four stages of cognitive development include: 1. Sensorimotor: Birth to ages 18-24 months. 2. Preoperational: Toddlerhood (18-24 months) through early childhood (age 7). 3. Concrete operational: Ages 7 to 11 years. 4. Formal operational: Adolescence to adulthood.
