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### Journal Writing Levels Of Questioning

Van Manen (1977) formed the basis for this type of hierarchal framework indicating three levels of reflection, namely; empirical- analytical, hermeneutic-phenomenological and critical- dialectical. At the empirical-analytical level emphasis is on effectiveness, efficiency and productivity.

### Reflective Writing through the Use of Guiding Questions

You may want to vary the approach of writing in the journal with some of the units studied. Students may grow in their writing and organization skills as you and they try new approaches. Intermediate students: Use drawings and diagrams. Encourage students to write questions about process or outcomes of explorations.

Knowledge. Identify. Label. This combination thus suggests that the designer can write multiple-choice questions for Bloom's first four levels of cognitive behavior (Knowledge, Comprehension, Application, and Analysis) since they require a predictable or calculable answer.

A free-write with a prompt. Starting a free-write with the smallest structure of a question, thought or topic can focus and frame the writing session. 14. Free Writing. Higher level questioning requires students to further examine the concept(s) under study through the use of application, analysis, evaluation, and synthesis while lower level questioning simply requires students to gather and recall information. Lower level questions are easier for teachers to produce but do not encourage students to engage in

### **The Importance of Questioning in Developing Critical ...**

When writing multiple choice items to test higher-order thinking, design questions that focus on higher levels of cognition as defined by Bloom's taxonomy. A stem that presents a problem that requires application of course principles, analysis of a problem, or evaluation of alternatives is focused on higher-order thinking and thus tests students' ability to do such thinking.

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
